Microsoft has released the latest upgrade of the Microsoft Operating system ---FREE for the next year, until July 28th, 2016 -- so there's no hurry. I am recommending that you wait 3-6 months for the hiccups to die down and it is safe to install.

If your computer has Windows 7 or 8 it is eligible to upgrade. If you have automatic updates enabled, you will receive a notice in your toolbar, down by the clock. It encourages you to Reserve Your Free Upgrade -- and I recommend that you do so. BUT, skip the email confirmation, ignore prompts to install the upgrade, and watch for a note from me telling you it is time to install **Windows 10!!!**

FACEBOOK: Savior or Satan spawn?

I have a love/hate relationship with Facebook. I love keeping up with far-flung friends and family, but I would rather not have that creepy guy from high school staring at my FB page-- knowing what I'm doing! Here is some information about privacy settings I hope you find helpful and easy to digest.

Do you know what your FB page shows the general public? Try this: click on your name on your FB page. This takes you to your Timeline page. Click on the "... " to the right of "View activity log," and choose **View As** ". This will show what the ANYBODY sees when they search for you on FB. Because I change my profile picture often, there was a huge history of photos of me, with my comments, available to the public. Profile pictures and cover photos are, by default, public! Yikes!

To change this, here's what to do: On your News Feed page (main page when you log in), click the small blue triangle in the upper right corner. Click Settings on the drop down

menu. Select Privacy in the sidebar on the left. Under "Who can see my stuff" choose **Limit Past Posts**

Facebook Settings Explained

The only way to keep data truly private is not to share it on Facebook at all. But there are steps users can take using their Facebook settings to manage the way the social network uses data. It's worth refreshing your account, privacy-wise, even if you're a seasoned and security-conscious site user, as new 'features' from Facebook often seem to involve further security concerns.

If you want to take control of your Facebook settings, it's best done from a PC or Mac -- Facebook's mobile apps don't offer the fine control that the browser version does.

Listed below are the five steps outlined in the ESET article -- how to change your basic settings in Facebook and how to ensure you're effectively managing what people know about you.

1. Take control of your posts.
2. Manage how others tag you
3. Check your Timeline
4. Delete Search History
5. Permanently Delete Account
